

Main goals

Flexibility of studies

- We will aim to increase the flexibility of studies by offering university the opportunity to implement hybrid theoretical lectures and will seek to give students the possibility to justify their absence due to illness.

Equal quality of studies in English and Lithuanian

- To ensure a uniform level of study quality in programs taught in English and Lithuanian, based on the representative system created during the first term of the ISAC, we will organize surveys and present possible solutions for ensuring their quality.
- We will also seek to ensure that academic staff working with international students meet the required standard of English language proficiency.

Representation of students living in dormitories

- Maintaining the continuity of the organization's activities, we will continue to develop the model of student representatives in dormitories. We will ensure that dormitory representatives receive accommodation discounts, publicize the principles of the model, and organize elections for dormitory representatives.

Newsletter initiative

- We will regularly inform students using the university newsletter system to ensure that information about the activities of the Student's Representation and the issues being addressed reaches all students, not just the group representatives and contact persons.

VILNIUS TECH SR Mentorship program

- We will work on establishing a mentorship program to improve the competence of student representatives, share knowledge, and ensure the continuity of the organization.

LSIC price coverage

- We will seek to ensure that all students enrolling at VILNIUS TECH are compensated for the cost of issuing a Lithuanian student identity card (LSIC), emphasizing that the LSIC is not a privilege but a necessary tool for the study process — it enables access to lecture halls, parking lots, the library, and work spaces, is required when paying for services, and provides vital discounts for cross-city and international travel.

Changing the academic calendar

- Following the example of other higher education institutions, we'll bring up the idea of integrating spring break into the academic community. We will hold a student referendum on possible changes to the academic calendar and will seek to have exam retakes before the commission is moved to July.

Review of study programs

- In accordance with the SR Strategy, we will continue the general review of study programs in all faculties to identify both faculty-specific and university-wide issues and address them at the university level.

Strengthening ethical culture at the university

- We will seek to implement ethics training for faculty and administration, strengthening a respectful, safe, and student friendly academic environment.

Student town

- We will continue the work began during the last term, focused on the development of the student campus in Saulėtekis, and we will aim to improve the university's infrastructure and create spaces that are important to students.

Analysis of job market needs

- We will conduct surveys of faculty social partners and companies where students do their internships to get a better understanding of job market needs and the relevance of study programs.

The representative's prestige project

- We will work on strengthening the role and motivation of representatives, improving the system of Academic group representative for more effective feedback collection, and monitoring the activity of representatives to increase their involvement.
